- **3.** Members who complete the 2x5 Challenge earn a cool Toastmasters mug!
- **4.** Given the limited number of speaking slots available, members need to sign up in advance to ensure that they can complete a manual speech at a meeting!
- **5.** Roles that count for CL projects include Toastmaster, General Evaluator, Evaluator, Speaker, Topicsmaster, Ah Counter, Grammarian, and Mentor to New Member.

Make the Most of your Manual

Manuals are meant to be used - how do you use yours?

How you make your Toastmasters manuals your own? Here are some simple ideas:

- Write your name on it front cover and inside cover at the very least to claim it as your own! Mailing label can be stuck to front cover to make name easier to see.
- 2. **Use post-it notes** to identify the different individual communication or leadership projects
- Mark your active project which one are you working on right now? Use a bookmark or post-it to flag your current goal
- 4. Track your Progress! Make sure you keep track of which projects you have completed by using the tracking tables in each manual. Ensure your VPE initials the project when you are done!
