Charting The Way For BLT



BLT Advanced chartered twenty-three years ago on November 1, 1997. These members were excited to be forever immortalized as Charter members of such a great club: Joanne Corbett - Pres, Cindy Schwindt - VPED, Spencer Silver - VPMPR, Shelley Redekopp – Treas, Connie Paus – Sec, Bev Ward – SAA, Janet Kwasniak, Brad Korbo, Robert Stedwill, Karen Haggarty, Lynn Silver, Marg Ollette, Jim Ollette, Joe Degenhardt, Father Joe, Maryann Samida, Curt Schroeder, Shirley Blyth, Alan McIntyre, and Ed Haid. Brad Korbo, DTM continues as a member. Connie Paus, Bev Ward, and until recently Janet Kwasniak remain as members of Toastmasters.

Why did we choose our name, BLT? The charter members enjoyed going for a meal after the meeting. Quite often the lunch menu included BLT sandwiches. When the club formed the focus was on quality evaluations, advanced or longer projects, and serving as a source of expertise for Division B. BLT stands for "B's Leading Team".

BLT continues to focus on those original guiding principles. In different times, BLT has been well represented at District conferences and winning the Mileage Meter Award for having the most members travelling the greatest distance to the conference. BLT continues to deliver educational sessions at every meeting, as well as workshops, that benefit the members of Division B. Many District leaders are/were members of BLT. This year: Ryan Rupchan is District 42's Club Quality Director: Camille Gibney is District 42's Administration Manager and last year's Division B Director; Debbie Stearns is Area B4 Director; Dan Lonechild is Area B9 Director; and Catherine Secundiak finished her year as 2019-20 Immediate Past District Director.

While the guiding principles have remained the same, the club has changed over the years. Originally BLT met every third Saturday. In December 2016, BLT added a supper meeting every month on the first Thursday of the month to allow potential members who were busy on Saturday to join the club. BLT recently enhanced its evaluation focus by adding a new role "Evaluator of the Evaluator" who provides feedback to the evaluators.

BLT strives to be an example to other clubs. Since 2011-12, BLT has been Presidents Distinguished club 8 of 9 years. Since Toastmaster International started electronic records in 2002, BLT has had 111 educational awards. Its members have many other awards given to their home clubs. BLT's website stores the Division B Contest Winners and the "Hall of Fame" awards. Many BLT members are winners of these awards over the years.

A Bit Of Humour:

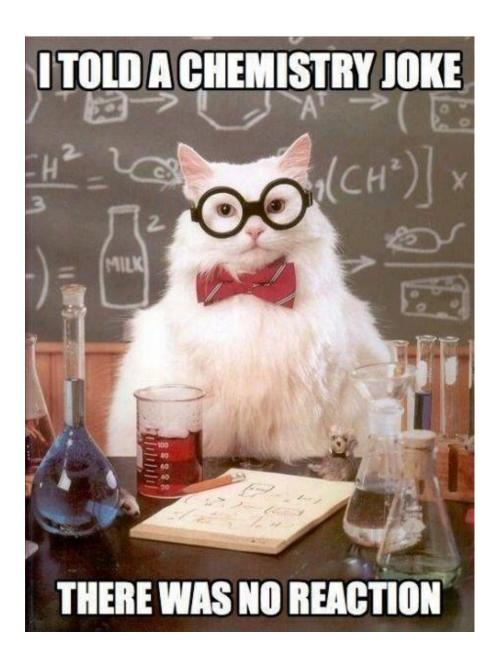
Good day everyone, I'd like to share a few jokes on Chemistry that I like to tell **periodically**!

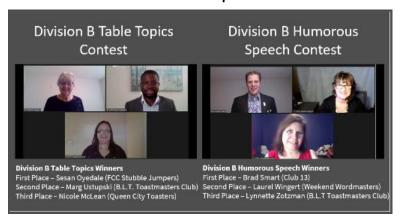

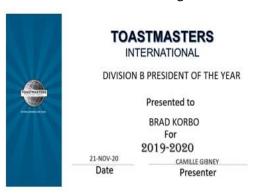

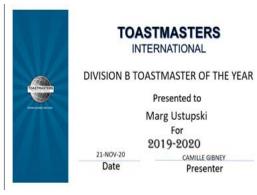
